**We Don't Buy Crime** has five key strands along with our **towns and villages**, we work with **second hand stores** and **fuel stations**, **deploy covert tactics**, and more recently look at ways our local communities can help tackle associated harm including **criminal exploitation and vulnerability**.

### Some of the team's other recent activities

- 19** farms across South Worcestershire having been subject to crime were visited and crime prevention advice given
- 29** rural businesses across South Worcestershire subject to crime were visited and provide with crime prevention advice
- 1** covert asset deployed in rural areas
- 9** Joint operation with local officers to patrol rural areas for wildlife crime and metal theft

### **Oil Theft Prevention**

A rise in the price of fuel at service stations inevitably leads to a rise in the cost of heating oil. This makes oil a more attractive proposition for the thief. A domestic oil tank can contain many hundreds of pounds worth of oil and it is therefore it makes good sense to take a few precautions to protect it.

Positioning of the tank to prevent theft of oil theft is important. Consider if the tank can be viewed from the road? Can it be seen from a window/house? Don't make it easy for the thief

#### **Locks**

A good thief may come equipped with a range of tools to attack your tank so consider using Closed Shackle padlocks



#### **Oil Level Alarms**

Remote electronic oil level gauges are now available which will set off an audible alarm if the oil level in the tank suddenly drops or falls below a quarter full.



#### **Security lighting**

Security lights can be used to identify the presence of thieves but balance this against 'lighting their way' Passive Infra-Red triggered lights' can alert you to their presence but can be subject of false alarms due to wildlife. Consider other lighting such as 'Dusk to Dawn' or timed lights. LED lamps can be more effective and cheaper to maintain. Solar powered LED lights can be used in areas without power sources

## **Defensive Planting on boundaries**

Can be effective in preventing access to tank areas

Examples include: Berberis, Rosa Rugosa 'Rubra', Pyracantha, Holly, Hawthorn. Ask your local garden centre for advice.

## **Fencing**

Fences and walls can also make life difficult for the thief. A wooden or metal fence, trellis or wall can give significant protection to the tank but it must be remembered that the oil tanker driver will need access to fill the tank. A metal grill or cage with a lockable access point across the top of this wall or fence can further improve security.

## **CCTV**

Before you consider using CCTV access exactly what you want to achieve from it?

### ***Images to aid prosecutions or being alerted to the presence of thieves***

Often offenders will try to remove or damage cameras

### ***Consider their position or using Dome Cameras***

How will you use the images that the system provides?

### ***To identify offenders***

Is the lighting going to assist your camera functions?

### ***Sometimes lighting can contribute to 'blurred' images so do the cameras have built in supportive lighting?***

Will any alerts from the cameras link to your **Smart** or **I phone**?

### ***IP cameras use Wi-Fi to send alerts to phones but 'SIM card enabled cameras can also provide this feature***

Please be aware and remain vigilant of phishing emails. One of the many scam emails currently in circulation purports to be from the TV Licensing advising to cancel direct debits. These messages may look like the real thing but are malicious. Once clicked, you are sent to a website which could download viruses onto your computer, or steal your passwords. The criminal's goal is to convince you to click on the links within their scam email or text message, or to give away sensitive information (such as bank details).

Report suspicious activity, people or vehicles. No matter how insignificant you might think it is, if it is suspicious to you, it probably is.

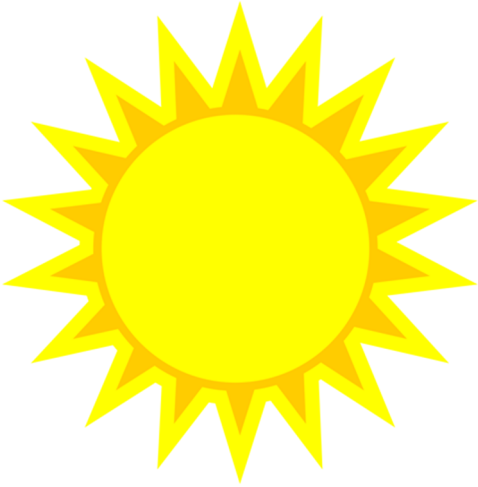
Also, REPORT CRIME! We know not all crime is reported to us, and we know the many reasons for that including frustration.

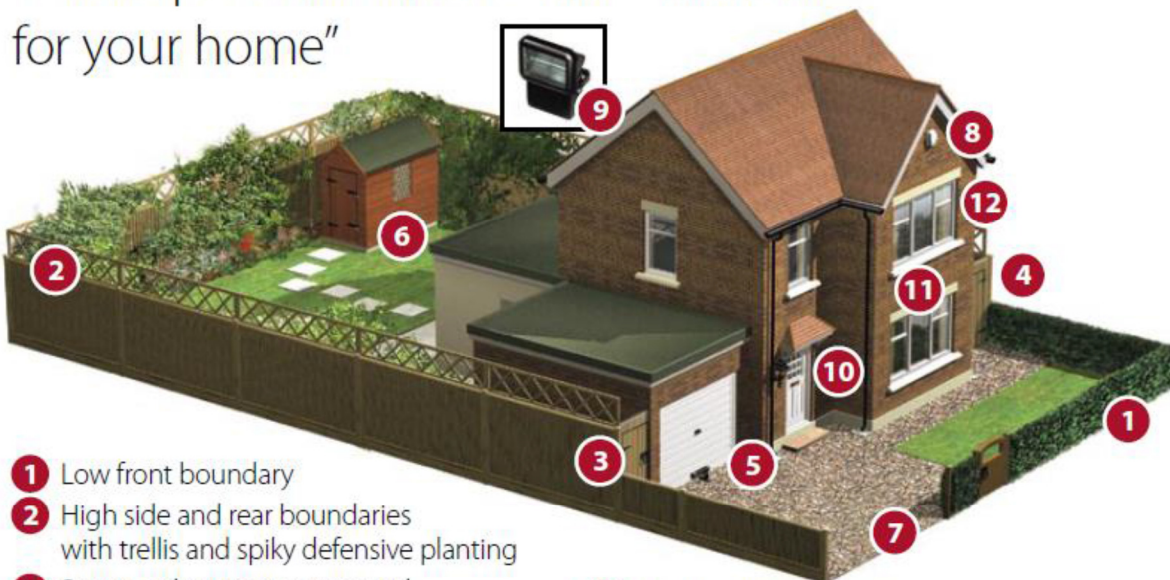

“Crime prevention recommendations for your home”



- 1** Low front boundary
- 2** High side and rear boundaries with trellis and spiky defensive planting
- 3** Secure side gate, not recessed
- 4** Wheelie bin behind secure gate
- 5** Secure garage door
- 6** Secure shed door and window
- 7** Gravel driveway and path
- 8** Intruder alarm system
- 9** Security light
- 10** Secure front door
- 11** Closed and locked windows
- 12** Valuables protected
